FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS


Where is it taking place?

It's being held at St. Marys University. The university is on Waldegrave Rd, Twickenham, TWI 4SX.

How do I get to St Mary's?

From Strawberry Hill station, it's a 10 minute walk. Go along Tower Road, turn right into Waldegrave Gardens, and at the end of this road the university is opposite you. Cross over, walk a hundred yards to your right, past the bus stop, and at the next entrance you'll be able to see the reception. Student ambassadors will meet you there. Keep an eye on the Aimhigher London Instagram Account for a short video of this walk.

Alternatively, follow Strawberry Hill Road down to the main road. The university is immediately to your right across the pelican crossing. Student ambassadors will meet you at the white gates. If you get lost on the day, call 07546 301238



Who will be attending?

Students who have SEND, or are neurodivergent from London and surrounding areas. Adults who support them are more than welcome. Teachers with groups of young people with SEND needs too

What access adjustments are there?

We have access to a Sensory room, perfect for anyone who needs a break from bright lights and noise. The room contains low multicoloured lights, fidget and support toys, beanbags and ear defenders. Our Campus is wheelchair accessible with a campus tour using wheelchair appropriate routes. We have disabled and gender-neutral toilets nearby the conference.

What will happen on the day?

There will be a full day of topics related to studying at university for those who will require extra support there. We'll cover planning next steps, assistive technology, evidencing your disability and the Disabled Student Allowances, how to disclose a disability and much more. Who will be leading the sessions?

There will be qualified and engaging speakers leading excellent workshops on what is available at university to support students. In addition, you'll meet incredibly passionate, friendly and informative student ambassadors, some of whom have had experiences of getting SEND or DSA support alongside their studies.

Yes, you can bring an adult with you. There will be other students who have adults with them too.

Do I need to bring lunch with me?

No, you don't need to bring lunch with you, unless you want to. There will be drinks in the morning and lunch will be provided. Food is halal. If you have any allergies, please do let us know in advance.
